This week we have been learning about the reasons why we celebrate Easter and have made Easter baskets and had a very exciting Easter Egg hunt around the garden! In Maths we have been learning all about odd and even numbers and trying really hard to write our numbers to 10 the correct way around!

**Wrens** have been learning about African folk tales, writing the story of Anansi the spider and how he got his long thin legs. In maths we've started looking at the divide sign, 3D shapes and their properties. In science we learnt about food chains and its impact on our lives.

We are so proud of our School Council and how busy they have been with organising fun events and raising funds for charities. Keep up the good work!


### Gardening Club
