Last week we celebrated Diwali and made Rangoli patterns with rice to welcome people to our classroom. We then made and decorated Diya pots. This week with have been finding out why we celebrate our birthdays! In Maths we have been busy finding different ways to make number bonds to five using a five frame and Numicon.

Swifts are very proud of their model coastlines which they made using mod-roc and clay with painted details. They have been very busy learning how to compare, order, add and subtract fractions in maths. In literacy, they have been writing some fascinating information texts about the Himalayas and some spooky ghost stories.
