# LOOK what we're LEARNING!

Robins have carried on with their space topic and looked at life on the International Space Station as an astronaut. Luckily for us the astronauts there did a live spacewalk to mend one of the satellites and we were able to see space and earth! Our rocket then took us to China to celebrate Chinese New Year. In Phonics we have been focusing on the digraphs ee and ur and writing lots of sentences. In Maths we have been learning the numbers 6 and 7.

Skylarks have been learning about plastic pollution in the oceans. The children have found this topic fascinating and very concerned this is happening to our Earth. In science, we have been learning about parts of plants and photosynthesis and in maths, we have started written methods of multiplication.



Wrens have loved delving into our topic of the UK, learning all about what a monarchy is and does, and even making up some laws for our own country! We have also been learning about the events of the Great Fire of London and have started writing our diary entries about the events back in 1666. In maths, we have been learning to measure length using rulers, and in PSHE we have been exploring and sharing ideas as a class as to what makes a good friend.

**Swifts** are enjoying their new class book 'Who Let the Gods Out', and have written some super diary entries from the perspective of the main character, Elliot. We are all enjoying the Ancient Greeks topic, and are finding out lots of information from primary and secondary sources. The story of Theseus and the Minotaur has inspired some maze design work and in art the children have been sketching pictures of gods and goddesses. They have been trying to get the proportions of the face and body as accurate as possible - it's surprising how long people's legs are in relation to the rest of their body! Swifts are also enjoying their science work all about light and will be using periscopes in their next lesson.
