### LOOK what we're LEARNING!

Robins have been continuing their celebration topic by finding out why Remembrance Day is celebrated and we made a poppy wreath for our classroom. This week we have been focussing on the Hindu celebration of Diwali. We discovered that Diwali is not on the same day each year, it is determined by the position of the moon. One of the traditions of Diwali is Rangoli Patterns and we have made our own patterns out of coloured rice to welcome people to our classroom. In phonics we have moved onto digraphs and we are beginning to write our own words independently. We have been so busy I nearly forget we had visits from the Police and Fire Brigade. We got to try on uniform, hold the handcuffs, sit in a fire engine and have a go with the hose!

Wrens have had a fantastic two weeks continuing to explore all their new topics. Their writing is developing each week and all the hard work they are doing at school and at home to learn their phonics is being noticed in their writing and reading. In math the children have enjoyed challenging themselves and putting their mathematical skills to the test. They are really enjoying learning about money and also practising counting in their multiples of 2's, 5's and 10's. Well done Wrens, keep up the good work!
