

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Robins have settled into the new term brilliantly! Our topic this half term is My Planet and Beyond. Last week we went to Antarctica and discovered it's at the bottom of the World. We found that penguins lived there and leant lots of different facts. This week our focus has been on London. We have been exploring the sights and learning about the King.

In PE Robins have had lots of fun learning to use the apparatus in the hall!

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Swifts have had a busy start to the term! We have finished our Fractions learning and have now moved on to Multiplication and Division. We have used our times table knowledge to help us multiply 4-digit numbers by 2 digits! We are really enjoying our English text - The Explorer by Katherine Rundell, we have written some amazing descriptive pieces about the rainforest. We can't wait for our independent writing next week! Our English also links brilliantly to our Geography topic of Rainforests - we just learnt about the four layers of the rainforest and got to draw these out.

We have started our new science topic on Plants and planted broad beans in jam jars. (This week the roots have started to grow!) We are keeping a bean diary!
