Robins have had a busy couple of weeks since the last Newsletter. We went on our first trip to The Norfolk Gymnastics Academy. We had a fantastic time and the children got to try all the equipment including the high beam!

PC Phillips came for a visit and let us into his police van where we were able to turn the siren on. He then told us how to keep safe. The advice he gave was for children to learn their full name, their parents' names and their address. If children know this information they are able to find parents in an emergency.

We have been busy writing short letters to people of our choosing in Literacy and have been able to write lots of words independently. In Maths we have been learning the names of 3d shapes and have been brilliant at using the correct terminology.

Wrens are really enjoying their English and History topics this half term. We are amazed at all the facts they have remembered and the new information a lot of them have discovered by researching our inspirational people at home. They have also created some writing pieces based on people they find inspiring and used alliteration to describe those people. We had an excellent dance workshop last week, where the Wrens got to try some Greek dancing. They all picked it up very quickly and had smiles on their faces from ear to ear. We have also noticed a fantastic improvement in the children's pace with their arithmetic questions we do every day after lunch for 5 minutes. They are whizzina through the questions now! We also want to thank all the grownups for helping the children with their weather reports, they were brilliant! Well done Wrens, keep shining!



Swifts As always, a busy couple of weeks in Swifts. We have now completed our biography unit, finishing our biographies on Greta Thunberg - we found out so much information about her (a lot of us were shocked that she'd been arrested for her protesting)! In Maths, we have been adding and subtracting decimals, as well as multiplying and dividing them by integers - we realised it's the same method we have been using in other calculations, so we just needed to use our times tables knowledge. In History, we have learned the story of the Anglo-Saxon hero, Beowulf, and his battle against Grendel. created storyboards to show the key events.

Skylarks In D.T. we have learnt about the key features of a castle and used these to help us design our own castle which must have the 3 Ss - Strength, Stiffness and Stability. Over the next 2 weeks we will be finalising our designs and building our castles piece by piece. This unit of learning also links in with Maths where we are looking at Shapes including symmetry and 3D shapes and nets. In English we have created our own poems using alliteration and prepositions. When we moved on to similes we played a new game called Loop Cards where everyone in the class had to work together to build a loop of joining similes - it was great fun! In French we are learning all about what is it like to be in a French classroom. The children did wonderful job of recalling the teacher's instructions in French and followed them at a fast pace! And they have also been listing the contents of their backpack in the partner game "Dans mon sac".
