Robins have had another busy fortnight. We have started to spend time in Wrens ready for next year. All of the children have taken this in their stride and been amazing. In Literacy we have been busy writing instructions to help me support the new Robins. In Maths we have been looking at maps and then made a map of the road from the Zoo to the post office. This half term our PE is ball skills. We have been absolutely brilliant at this and have been in control of our ball at all times.

On top of all of this we had a trip to the Sea Life Centre and the beach. The staff at the centre commented on how lovely, kind and well behaved all the children were. We are very proud of them.

Wrens A great couple of weeks in and out of the classroom! We had a super time with Vivian learning how to line dance. The Sea Life Centre and beach trip was so fabulous! Everyone was brilliant and had an amazing time! Thank you to all the adults who helped make this trip happen. We have enjoyed learning about life cycles in science and watching our caterpillars turn into butterflies! We have been busy designing and making our Ferris wheels in DT! In maths, we have enjoyed investigating measuring mass and we have been baking. We are enjoying learning about volume and capacity through investigating how much water different containers hold. We really enjoyed welcoming the Robins into our classroom to spend some time with us and Year 2s have been spending a bit of time up in Skylarks, getting ready for September. We are continuing to work hard on our handwriting and times tables in particular! Wow, Wrens! Well done all of you!

Skylarks In Maths, Skylarks have started looking at tenths and hundredths as decimals. They have made a cracking start! They are continuing to write descriptive sentences for a fantasy story, Aladdin. They are loving placing themselves in Aladdin's shoes and listening to a different version of the story. In addition, they have been learning more about Islam and how Muslims celebrate marriage and mark the death of a loved one. The children were keen to share their own experiences of weddings in their own families and of people and pets they have lost and how they remember them now. In Maths we have been learning about angles and turns. We have made our own angle makers and angle finders to identify acute, obtuse and right angles in the classroom and the children have given directions to their partner to make turns in both clockwise and anticlockwise directions.

Swifts What a couple of weeks it has been in Swifts! Last week, most of us went onto our residential trip to Eaton Vale - it was amazing! We did so many fun things: canoeing, buggy building, grass sledging, trapeze, problem solving, crate stacking, obstacle course, etc. All the children were so well behaved and respectful to everyone around and everybody tried new things. Mrs Thomas, Mrs Martin and Mr Lambert are incredibly proud of them all for pushing themselves out of their comfort zones and being resilient and courageous when trying all of these different activities.
