In maths, we have been adding and taking away and finding out about length. We made bug hotels in Forest School to link with our habitats work in science. We have worked hard in our computing lessons and we can now log in and use Sketchpad on the Chromebook. We really enjoyed using the apparatus in our PE lesson this week! Well done Wrens! Swifts What a fantastic end to 2025! Swifts have worked so hard over the Autumn term, and they all need to be incredibly proud of themselves. In Maths we are now coming towards the end of our Multiplication and Division B unit - we are now able to do long multiplication (4 digits x 2 digits) and long division! We are going to be moving on Fractions B when we come back!

In English, we have written diary entries from the point of view of either Ellie or Daniel from our class book The Nowhere Emporium. We had to remember to write in the first person and in the past tense to describe events that have already happened. We will also be writing a wintery narrative next week using description and dialogue to move our story forward.

We have really enjoyed our Science this term - we have looked at how different organisms are classified. We then looked at microorganisms and carried out an investigation on bread to see how mould grows.

We're looking forward to the new term and the new year. We can't wait to learn even more and keep on progressing and getting better! Have a wonderful break and a merry Christmas.

Skylarks have continued to enjoy learning about the Stone Age to the Iron Age. They have now completed their Stone Age stories and will be moving on to a Stone Age fact file.
